Re: California Public Records Act (CPRA) request 019-090

Dear Mr. Alexander:

Thank you very much for your letter of July 28, 2020 regarding CPRA request 019-090. My sincere apologies for not providing responsive documents sooner. UCSF had been working on the reply, and I see now that I did not transmit the documents as I had intended.

Please find attached 9 pages of responsive documents. Redactions have been made to some content pursuant to California Government Code Sections 6254(c) and 6255, which state that an agency may justify withholding any record by demonstrating that the record in question is exempt under express provisions of the code, or that "on the facts of the particular case the public interest served by not making the record public clearly outweighs the public interest served by disclosure of the record." After a series of incidents of harassment, vandalism, and threats against researchers, the University of California began to routinely redact names and location information from records related to sensitive research projects in order to protect the safety of individuals working in those areas.

UCSF has identified an additional 65 pages of responsive documents and is reviewing them for potentially exempt information now. The University appreciates you setting the date of Friday, August 7, 2020, for full compliance. UCSF will provide the additional documents as soon as possible and under no condition beyond that deadline.

The University does note that the fifth element of the request is overly broad: "Any official University of California San Francisco staff, trustee and faculty memorandums, email, or other communications regarding Planned Parenthood, Planned Parenthood Affiliates of California, or Planned Parenthood Federation of America." The University would like to assist you in making a focused request that can be processed. One way to do that would be to list a date range or specific individual involved in correspondence.

Again, I regret the need for you to send a reminder and request for status.
